

WORKERS' COMP WORKS

FOR YOU.

Workers' Compensation Insurance pays your medical bills and other expenses and replaces part of your salary if you have an accidental personal injury or disease caused by your job.

You should expect if you are disabled and unable to work for more than three (3) days to be compensated for loss of earnings at a rate of up to two-thirds of your salary, limited to the maximum as set by law.

**If you are
injured on the job,
you should:**

1.
Notify your employer or supervisor at once. You can't receive full benefits unless your employer knows you're injured.

2.
Tell the doctor who treats you that you were hurt on the job.

3.
Complete an Employee's Claim Form and send it to the Workers' Comp Commission as soon as possible. You can obtain the form from the Commission without charge. Call Workers' Comp at 1-800-492-0479 or 767-0900 (Baltimore Area) for more info, or if you experience undue delays or problems.

This Notice of Compliance must be posted by the employer and maintained conspicuously in and about the employer's place or places of business.
